## Teaching

### Graduate level

#### 2006-till now

**National Technical University of Athens (NTUA)** Fall semester: *History of Civilization* (School of Rural and Surveying Engineering), *Sociology of Science and Technology and Culture* (School of Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering and School of Mechanical Engineering), *History of Philosophy of Science and Technology* (School of Mining and Metallurgical Engineering) and *Environmental Policy* (School of Applied Mathematical and Physical Sciences). Spring semester: *Introduction to the Philosophy of Science* (School of Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering). More specifically my undergraduate subjects of teaching:

#### 2006-

**NTUA, School of Rural and Surveying Engineering (5th)** Fall semester: *History of Civilization*: a comprehensive survey of basic periods in the History of the World Civilization. The narration points to the climatic change and the role of the technological evolution in the environmental crisis. Nature is not detached from the notion of civilization, since within the environment civilization is also at risk. Consequently the lesson is not western-focused, but encompasses the alteration of the environment due to the climatic change.

#### 2006-

**School of Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering and NTUA, School of Mechanical Engineering (1st)** Fall semester: *Sociology of Science and Technology and Culture*: The subject examines the notions of science and technology, investigates their content and the impact of technology on the social, ethical, political and cultural aspects of the world. It surveys the influence of technology on science and on the environment aiming to the comprehension and assessment of the technological impact on the climatic change. It is divided in two parts: the first part deals with the 'Science of Sociology' discussing and defining science and sociology, with reference to their founders and theorists. Later the discussion enters the relation of technology with globalisation, the mechanisms of tradition and the apparatus of modernity. The second part specializes in issues of 'Sociology of Science and Technology' perceiving technology as a component of modernism, discussing technocracy, modernity and post-modern approaches of identity issues in multi-cultural urban spaces. Within the teaching hours there are half-hour students' presentations of articles or subjects proposed by the lecturer. Lecturer's notes accompany the reference book [Pacey A., 2001, *Meaning in Technology*, Cambridge, MA: MIT Press- in a Greek edition]]

#### 2006-

**NTUA, School of Mining and Metallurgical Engineering (1st)** Fall semester: *History and Philosophy of Science and Technology*. The textbook taught is David C. Lindberg's

*The Origins of Western Science* (1992) published in Greek in 1997. The subject investigates the conceptual content of science since the antiquity era (6 c. B.C) until Renaissance (1450); in this narrative it surveys the multivariable philosophical, religious and institutional European scientific tradition. The scientific evolution is thus integrated within a philosophical and institutional framework and the Eastern influence on this evolution is also underlined. The students are offered the possibility to prepare a presentation or a written paper in collaboration with the lecturer.

**2007-**

**NTUA, School of Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering (8th sem.) Spring semester:** *Introduction to the Philosophy of Science* (with Prof. V. Karasmanis). The narration follows the contents of the Alan F. Chalmer's 1992 textbook *What is This Thing Called Science* published in in Greek. The topics of the textbook contain inductionsim, falsificationism, theories as structures, Kuhn's Paradigms, rationalism compared to relativism, Feyerabend's anarchic theory of knowledge. The lectures are introduced by a comprehensive historic survey of Philosophy focused on Philosophers of Science. There is also a condensed seminar on writing an academic paper. The students are offered the possibility to prepare a presentation with the lecturer.
